

Minehead Seafront Open Air Gallery Photo Competition Terms and Conditions

The organisers reserve the right to modify these terms and conditions without notice.

Competition entry

1. By entering the Competition, you agree to the provisions of these Terms and Conditions and to comply fully with them.
2. All information detailing how to enter this Competition forms part of these terms and conditions. It is a condition of entry that all rules are accepted as final, and that the competitor agrees to abide by these rules. The decision of the judges is final, and no correspondence will be entered into. Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of these terms and conditions.
3. The theme of the competition is 'Minehead - Then and Now' where existing images/photographs taken in or around Minehead from the olden days depict its past history and heritage. Equally, we are looking for modern day recently taken images/photographs of interest in or around Minehead that capture Minehead and its community as it is now.
4. All photographs must be entered electronically by email and sent to comp@mineheadandcoast.org.uk
5. Entries must be labelled with the entrant's name and location of the photograph and image files must be 200 dpi and between 1MB and 3MB. Entrants should include their own name, address and telephone number. We regret that we are unable to accept postal entries.
6. All entries must be received by the advertised closing time and date, received by 30 June 2022.
7. If you are under the age of 18, you must have permission to enter the Competition from your parent or guardian. By submitting an entry for the competition, your parent/carer/guardian is deemed to have given such consent and to agree to the use of the entry as described in these terms and conditions.
8. The Organisers cannot be held responsible for emails that do not arrive due to the entrant's email security settings or restrictions placed by their internet service provider.
9. If your photograph features any person or people, they should be aware that they are being photographed and permission should be obtained from all involved (or their parent's/guardian's permission if under 16) for their photograph to be submitted in the competition. If it is clear that the people are not aware of their picture being taken or are embarrassed in any way by any entry we receive, Minehead and Coast Development Trust reserves the right to disqualify the entry.
10. Only one entry per person. Late, illegible, incomplete, defaced or corrupt entries will not be accepted. No responsibility can be accepted for lost entries and proof of transmission will not be accepted as proof of receipt. Entries must not be sent through agencies or third parties.

11. The winning entries will be those that are judged to be the most visually appealing, original and self-explanatory. The winners will be notified within fourteen days of the closing date of the competition.

Copyright and reproduction

1. You must be the sole author and owner of the copyright for all images entered. You will retain copyright of your entries at all times and always be credited alongside your picture.
2. Copyright in all images submitted for this Competition remains with the respective entrants. However, in consideration of their providing the Competition, each entrant grants a worldwide, irrevocable, perpetual licence to Minehead and Coast Development Trust and SWT Council to feature any or all of the submitted images in any of their publications, their websites and/or in any promotional material connected to this competition.

Usage Rights

1. By entering your images into the competition, you grant permission to Minehead and Coast Development Trust exclusive license to reproduce the images for the following purposes:
 - Printing of winning and highly commended photographs in local media. We ask that the press credit photographers where the images are used but cannot be held responsible for errors and omissions.
 - Inclusion of winning photographs shall be displayed on the Minehead Seafront Open Air Gallery and credited.
 - If used for any other purpose or MCDT and Council related social media accounts, photographers will be credited alongside their work.

Data Protection

The information you provide will be collected and stored by Minehead and Coast Development Trust and processed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. We will only use your information for the purposes of administration of the Competition (including publishing your name and title of the image if you are a winner) and any other purposes to which you have consented. We will not pass your details on to any third party.

Indemnity and Limitation of Liability

To the maximum extent permitted by law, Minehead and Coast Development Trust excludes its liability for any loss, damage, injury, cost or expense suffered by you, whether directly or indirectly and howsoever caused, in connection with the Competition. Nothing in these Terms and Conditions shall exclude Minehead and Coast Development Trust's liability for death or personal injury arising from their own negligence or any other liability that cannot, as a matter of law, be excluded.

You agree to indemnify Minehead and Coast Development Trust and keep Minehead and Coast Development Trust indemnified against any loss, damage, injury, cost or expense suffered by Minehead and Coast Development Trust as a result of your entry in the Competition, including (but not limited to) any claim of infringement of intellectual property rights made by any third party.
